## **School Campus**



- English is used when making announcements during morning assemblies and major school functions.









#### Pursuits of Our Graduates in the past 2 years


 Percentage of S6 graduates who have secured a place in universities or tertiary institutions (Including Degree, Associate Degree and Higher Diploma courses)




# Unfilled Places in the past 2 years

## Students' Early Exit in the past 2 years












#### Teachers' Teaching Experience in the past 2 years




 Principal's Continuing Professional Development (CPD) in the past 2 years. (Number of hours in activities related to structured learning, action learning and service to education and the community.)

# Major Concerns 2022-2023 (Strategies, Success Criteria, Actual Progress & Follow-up Suggestions)

#### Major Concern 1: Nurturing students to be self-directed learners and catering for their diverse learning needs

#### **Strategies**

#### Area 1: Motivate students to self-direct their learning

- Curriculum development (revise school timetable, strengthen National Security Education and Values Education, review the existing curriculum).
- Encourage students to design their personalized learning method, provide tools and materials for students to be self-directed learners.
- Promoting reading through DEAR periods, reading across the curriculum in all subjects and library activities.

#### Area 2: Cater for the diverse learning needs of students

- Review the sequence of the content in the curriculum, optimize the pedagogies and resources, set appropriate teaching objectives to cater for students' diverse learning needs.
- · Establish peer learning groups among students.
- Reinforce assessment as learning and assessment for learning among teachers.
- Adopt various means of assessment tasks.
- Share effective pedagogies or good practices at department level.
- Arrange formal lesson observations and peer observations in the focus of catering for the diversified learning.

#### **Success Criteria**

#### Area 1: Motivate students to self-direct their learning

- Students can develop creativity, collaboration skill, problem solving skill and presentation skill through project learning and cross-curriculum learning.
- National Security Education and Positive Values Education are organically integrated and naturally connected into curriculum.
- Clear aims, objectives, scope of works, teaching and learning objectives of each section are stated in the teaching progress.
- Book sharing by teachers and students have been done during the DEAR periods.
- Reading across the curriculum has been done in all subjects.
- The borrowing rate of books in School Library has raised by 5 % compared with the school year 2021-22.
- In the Stakeholders' survey, 70% of the students and 60% of the parents show their views that "I / My child often read materials such as leisure reading materials and newspapers outside class."
- Workshops on note-taking skills for F.1 and F.2 students have been conducted, all teachers have joined the workshop and tried out the self-directed learning strategies within the lesson.
- Students can design their personalized learning methods such as pre-lesson study and post-lesson summary-making.

#### Area 2: Cater for the diverse learning needs of students

- Seminar on enhancing the teaching techniques for students with diverse learning needs is arranged for teachers and over 80% of teachers can apply the effective pedagogies introduced to teaching.
- Learning support programmes for gifted students and low achievers are provided.
- Over 90% of students can handle the graded exercises which suit their levels.
- Students have a self-evaluation by figuring out the mistakes and seeking improvements after tests and examinations.
- Students' efforts are appreciated by an achievable reward scheme.

#### **Actual Progress**

#### Area 1: Motivate students to self-direct their learning

- The elements of National Security Education and Positive Values Education have been organically integrated and naturally connected into curriculum. They are clearly stated in the teaching progress of all subjects.
- Aims, objectives, scope of works, teaching and learning objectives of each section are clearly stated in the revised teaching progress.
- Book sharing by teachers and students have been done during the DEAR periods,
- All subjects have designed subject-based reading and cross-curriculum reading activities.
- Workshops on note-taking skills for F.1 and F.2 students have been conducted (26/9/2022 and 3/10/2022) successfully. Most of the F.1 and F.2 students can apply the note-taking skills in their homework.
- The borrowing rate of books in School Library is 20.4 item /day in the school year 2022-23. The rate was 20.6 item / day in the school year 2021-22.
- In the Stakeholders' Survey, 49% of the students showed that "I often read materials such as leisure reading materials and newspapers outside class." and 48% of the parents showed that "My child likes reading.".
- In the Stakeholders' Survey, students have positive feedback on learning:
  - 54% of students showed that "I take an active role in learning inside and outside of the classroom."
  - 48% of students showed that "I am confident in learning inside and outside of the classroom."
  - 50% of students showed that "I enjoy learning inside and outside of the classroom."
  - 54% of students showed that "I know how to set my own learning goals."
  - 53% of students showed that "I know how to apply learning strategies, such as doing pre-lesson preparation, using concept maps and on-line resources."

#### Area 2: Cater for the diverse learning needs of students

- All teachers have joined the professional development workshop about enhancing the teaching techniques for students with diverse learning needs. From the results of the survey,
  - 100% of the entire teaching staff agreed that "The theme of this workshop addresses the needs and concerns over my work."
  - 100% of the entire teaching staff agreed that "The workshop enhanced my knowledge of catering for learning diversity of students."
  - 100% of the entire teaching staff agreed that "The workshop was stimulating and thought-provoking."
  - 97.8% of the entire teaching staff agreed that "This workshop provided concrete and practical suggestions."
  - 97.8% of the entire teaching staff agreed that "I will implement the knowledge gained from this workshop."
  - In all, the overall impression of the teaching staff towards the workshop is positive.
- Learning support programmes for gifted students and F.1 to F.3 low achievers are provided by our school and external organizations such as HKAGE and HKUST.
- In the Stakeholders' Survey:
  - 68% of students showed that "The teachers often teach us learning strategies, such as doing pre-lesson preparation, using concept maps and on-line resources."
  - 58% of students showed that "Teachers often provide suggestions on my performance and let me know how to improve."
  - 60% of students showed that "Teachers' questions inspire my thinking inside and outside of the classroom."
  - 62% of students showed that "Teachers often allow us to explore a variety of topics inside and outside of the classroom."
  - 62% of students showed that "Teachers often organise different learning activities both inside and outside of the classroom, such as discussion, visits, sharing of insights gained from reading and oral presentation."
  - 55% of students showed that "I often reflect on my performance in class, test and examination results, as well as teachers' suggestions, such as their comments on my assignments, in order to reflect on and improve my learning."

#### **Follow-up Suggestions**

Our school goes through a planning, implementation, and evaluation (PIE) process every year. By evaluating the 2022-23 annual plan, which is the first year of the Three-year Development Plan (2022-25), follow-up actions are taken in the coming academic year.

- To improve students' self-directed learning skills through reading and note-taking.
  - Workshops on note-taking skills for F.1 and F.2 students would be conducted by Chinese, English, Science and PSHE teachers.
  - Book sharing of teachers and students during the DEAR periods.
  - One reading period would be implemented into the school timetable for F.1 and F.2 students.
  - More reading activities and reading promotion from library.
- Strengthen the National Security Education, Values Education and the importance of 7 Learning Goals.
- 7 Learning Goals would be integrated and naturally connected into curriculum. They would be clearly stated in the annual plan of all subjects.

#### Major Concern 2: Promoting positive values education and good mental health to help students live a purposeful life

#### **Strategies**

#### Area 1: To nurture students with Positive Values Education

- Elements of positive values have been instilled in all subjects. Reinforce elements of Positive Values Education in assemblies and OLE lessons.
- Whole-school activities and programs organised by action groups or task groups to promote positive values education.
- Activities organised by Moral and Civic Education task groups and subjects to promote Chinese culture and national identity.
- Create more opportunities for students to serve others and the community.
- Equipped class teachers with professional knowledge and enhance the effectiveness of classroom management.

#### Area 2: Promoting physical health and mental health by developing good habits and peer support

- Talks on developing healthy habits will be held to promote physical health.
- Activity of promoting physical ability will be held.
- Arrange talks on promotion of mental health for teachers, students, and parents.
- Organise special program to promote healthy lifestyle.
- Different schemes on peer support will be organized to promote peer support.
- Organise thanksgiving activity to nurture grateful attitude.

#### **Success Criteria**

#### Area 1: To nurture students with Positive Values Education

- The elements of positive values education have been included in all subjects and have been shown in the teaching progress.
- Whole-school activities and programs have been organized to promote positive Values education.
- Students are willing to abide by the law and regulations, their recognition of national identity is uplifted.
- 40% of the Junior form and 25% of the Senior form students have taken part in voluntary service.

#### Area 2: Promoting physical health and mental health by developing good habits and peer support

- Students' awareness of the significance of their physical health is aroused and their physical fitness is uplifted.
- Students' awareness of the significance of their own mental health is aroused and the score of negative emotions is lowered and the score of self-concept is uplifted.
- Students are more willing to share with others and ask for help when they are in need.
- Positive feedback from teachers and students for the assembly of moral education.
- Students are willing to practice thanksgiving by writing records of gratitude.

#### **Actual Progress**

#### **Area 1: To nurture students with Positive Values Education**

- The elements of Positive values Education have been organically integrated and naturally connected into curriculum. They are clearly stated in the teaching progress of all subjects.
- The following programs, talks or activities have been conducted to nurture students with Positive Values Education:
  - Talk on "Cyber bullying"
  - Talk on "Prevention of gambling"
  - Drugs Prevention Week
  - Talk on "Establishing positive attitude towards romantic relationships"
  - Game Booth Day on "No Gambling"
  - Thanksgiving activities in Fellowships and Cell Group activities
- 82% of the students in F.3 agreed that the programs conducted in OLE lessons can help them to develop positive values.
- 47% of the Junior form and 3.2% of the Senior form students have taken part in voluntary service.
- In the Stakeholders' Survey,
  - 56% of students showed that "Teachers help us resolve problems related to growing up, such as those related to our physical and mental development, making friends and our studies."
  - 63% of students showed that "The school actively teaches us how to get along with others, such as showing respect for others and being considerate."
  - 64% of students showed that "The school helps us develop good moral character inside and outside of the classroom."
  - 49% of students showed that "My schoolmates are self-disciplined and follow rules."
- In APASO-III,
  - The Q-score of the subscale "Meaning in Life" is 109.
  - The Q-score of the subscale "Honesty (Act of Honesty)" is 110.
  - The Q-score of the subscale "Morality (Importance)" is 116.
  - The Q-score of the subscale "National Identity (Responsibility, Obligations)" is 116.
  - The Q-score of the subscale "National Identity (Proud, Love)" is 116.
  - The Q-score of the subscale "National Identify (National Flag, Anthem)" is 116.
  - The Q-score of the subscale "National Identity (Achievements)" is 116.

#### Area 2: Promoting physical health and mental health by developing good habits and peer support

- By comparing the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> term results of the physical fitness test of F.1 to F.5 students, both boys and girls have shown improvement in their muscles strength, flexibility and muscular endurance in the 2<sup>nd</sup> term.
- The following programs or talks have been conducted to promote physical health and mental health:
  - Talk on "Healthy Lifestyle and Mental health" from Chinese medication aspect
  - Workshops on "Stresstegy"
  - Workshop on Kin-Ball, Pastel Nagomi Art and healthy spine have been held in Staff Development Days
  - Gatekeeper student ambassadors

- Thanksgiving culture has been cultivated through fellowship and cell group activities. Records of gratitude have been made by students in RE lessons, teachers agreed that students are more willing to thank others.
- In the Stakeholders' Survey, 56% of students showed that "I live a healthy life, such as striking a balance between study and rest, doing enough physical exercise, and knowing how to reduce stress."
- In APASO-III,
  - The Q-score of the subscale "Physical Exercise" is 85.
  - The Q-score of the subscale "Affect (No Negative Affect)" is 101.
  - The Q-score of the subscale "Affect (No Anxiety, Depressive Symptoms)" is 85.
  - The Q-score of the subscale "Affect (No Academic Anxiety)" is 110.
  - The Q-score of the subscale "Affect (No Psychosomatic Symptoms)" is 107.
  - The Q-score of the subscale "Social Behaviour (Time with Friends)" is 106.
  - The Q-score of the subscale "Self-concept (Physical Appearance)" is 109.

#### **Follow-up Suggestions**

- A specific value can be promoted by different subjects. The department heads can share their goals in the joint subject-head meetings.
- The head of each group can discuss the specific values involved in the activities held and introduce them to students before the start of the activity.
- The Discipline Week only lasted for three days. It is by no means adequate. A whole week of activities is suggested for the next school year.
- The workshop arranged by Discipline Action Group was too brief to enhance the skills and knowledge of the teachers to discipling students with love. It is suggested that a more well-organized workshop can be held for teachers in the coming school year. Sharing session can be held to create learning circle.
- Exhibitions on special dates can be organized to arouse the students' awareness of their national identity.
- More publicity work should be done to promote the participation of voluntary service.
- Activity or exercises can be introduced to students to enhance their physical fitness.
- The workshops and activities concerning mental health should continue to be held to cater for the needs of the students.
- Teachers and students can be invited to share in the morning assembly or student fellowships to promote the atmosphere of thanksgiving.




